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About This Document

This document tracks and shares local agency best practice activities completed and counted as part of a city or county's participation the climate change and sustainability recognition program, the Beacon Award: Local Leadership toward Solving Climate Change. The Beacon Award is a statewide program recognizing cities and counties that are working to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, save energy and adopt policies and programs that promote sustainability.

The Beacon Award is sponsored by the Institute for Local Government and the Statewide Energy Efficiency Collaborative. The Statewide Energy Efficiency Collaborative (SEEC) provides support to cities and counties to help them reduce greenhouse gas emissions and save energy. SEEC is an alliance between three statewide non-profit organizations and California's four Investor-Owned Utilities. It builds upon the unique resources, expertise and local agency relationships of each partner.

















This program is funded by California utility ratepayers and administered by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas and Electric, Company, Southern California Edison, and Southern California Gas Company under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission.

Gold	 Established an Interdepartmental Green Action Team (GAT) that meets regularly to discuss a variety of sustainable topics including implementation of the City's EPP program. The GAT was instrumental in establishing the EPP and their continued support and feedback ensures that the program is being successfully implemented. 	08-2012
	 EPP policy requires the city purchase remanufactured products such as toner cartridges, tires, furniture, equipment and automotive parts whenever practicable, but without reducing safety, quality or effectiveness. 	08-2012
Platinum	EPP policy requests vendors to eliminate packaging or use the minimum amount necessary for product protection, to the greatest extent practicable.	08-2012

EPP policy requires all products for which the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established minimum recycled content standard guidelines in the Agency's Comprehensive Procurement Guidelines, such as those for printing paper, office paper, janitorial paper, construction, landscaping, parks and recreation, transportation, vehicles, miscellaneous,	08-2012

and non-paper office products, shall contain the highest postconsumer content, but no less than the minimum recycled content standards established by the U.S. EPA Guidelines, when practicable.

3. EPP requires that all products purchased by the city and for which the U. S. EPA Energy Star certification is available shall meet Energy Star certification, when practicable. When Energy Star labels are not available, the City of Union City shall choose energy-efficient products that are in the upper 25% of energy efficiency as designated by the Federal Energy Management Program.
